Our Stopover Supported Housing Service has two houses, providing different levels of supported accommodation for homeless or insecurely housed young women aged 16–24. Working closely with our service users, you'll provide practical and emotional support, act as their key worker and assist them with claiming for welfare benefits. You'll also help them to create Independent Living Plans to help them develop the necessary skills to live independent lives. Experience in a similar setting as a project worker will be essential. This will be matched with excellent communication skills and in particular, the ability to engage effectively with vulnerable young women and understand their varying needs.

You must be able to work as part of a rota system and provide sleep-in and out-of-hours on-call cover as required.
